

ABOUT THE SELWYN PROJECT

The Selwyn Project is a proposed zinc-lead mine, located in Howard's Pass in eastern Yukon, 165 km east of Ross River and 280 km north of Watson Lake, on the border with the Northwest Territories. The project is one of the largest undeveloped zinc-lead deposits in the world.

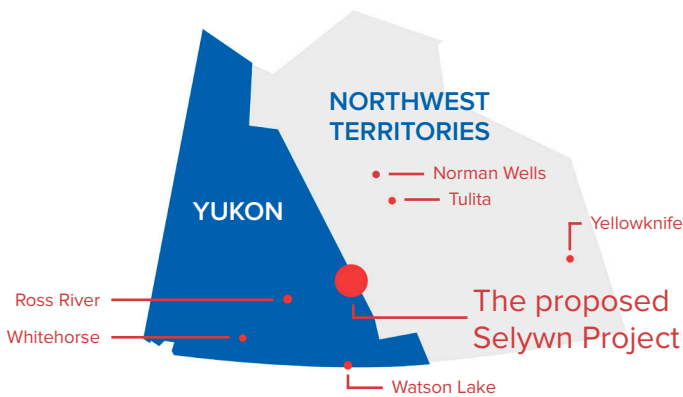
The Selwyn Project is in the advanced exploration phase. This means Selwyn Chihong, with its team of experts and consultants, is doing the technical and environmental research and studies required to design the proposed mine and begin preparing to submit the project the environmental and socio-economic assessment process.

The Selwyn Project is owned and operated by Selwyn Chihong Mining Ltd., (Selwyn Chihong), the Canadian subsidiary of Yunnan Chihong Zinc & Germanium Co., Ltd.



WHAT WILL THE PROPOSED MINE LOOK LIKE?

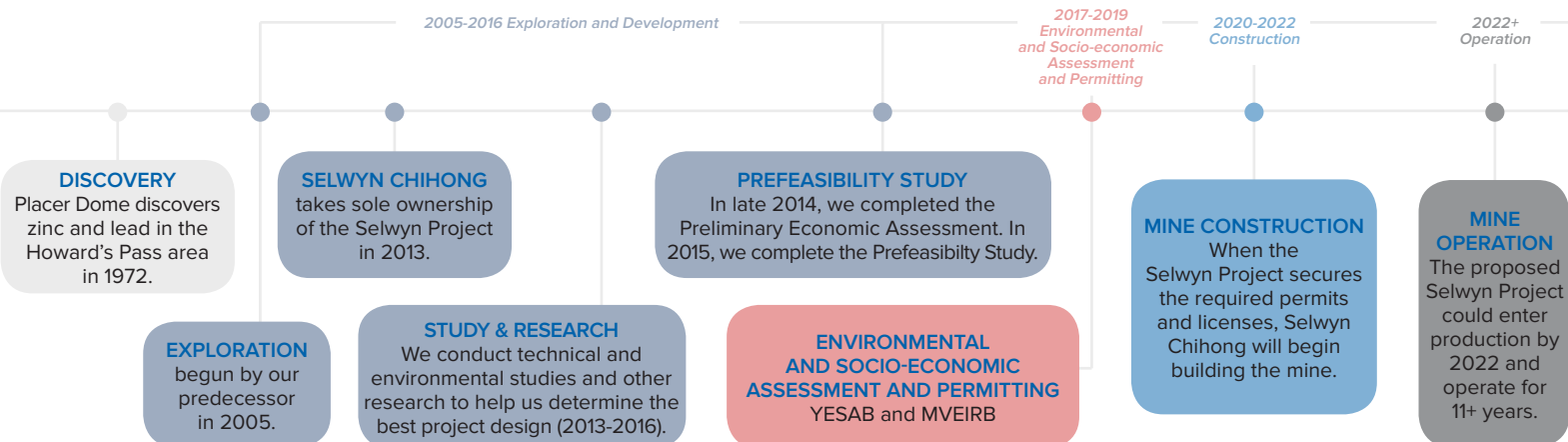
The proposed Selwyn Project is still being designed and developed. The Project as it is proposed today would be an open pit zinc-lead mine with a projected mine life of more than 11 years. The mine is being designed to process 35,000 tonnes per day (tpd) of ore which, after processing, is expected to result in 2,500 tpd of zinc concentrate and 600 tpd of lead concentrate. Once processed, the concentrate would be trucked to the Port of Stewart for shipping.



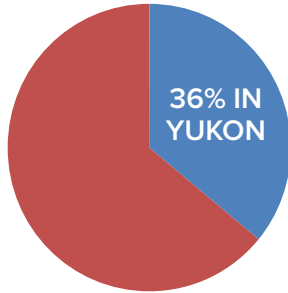
OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLES FOR DEVELOPING THE SELWYN PROJECT

4. Create and sustain healthy, safe environments for communities and our employees.

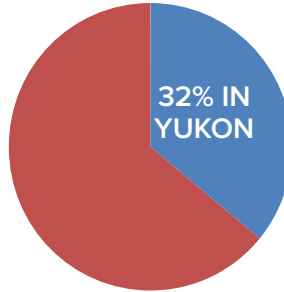
SELWYN CHIHONG'S SELWYN PROJECT DEVELOPMENT TIMELINE

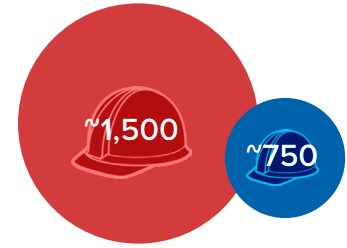

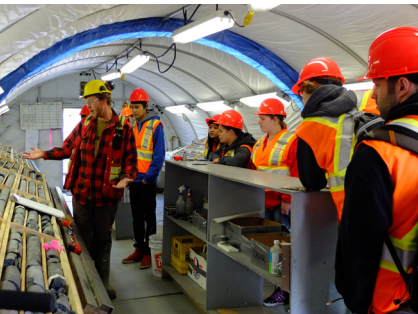

RESPECTING THE ENVIRONMENT AND THE PEOPLE AND PLACES WHERE WE WORK

We need to understand the wildlife, fish, waterways, water quality and traditional knowledge in and around the proposed mine as we develop the proposed Selwyn Project. We have baseline environmental data for the Selwyn Project from 2005 onward and continue to conduct technical and environmental research to help us understand the geography, geology and environment around our

project site. We are also working with the Kaska to complete a Traditional Knowledge Study.

We are developing and implementing ISO compliant systems for camp operations and environmental management (ISO 14001 - Environmental Management and ISO 9001 - Quality Management Systems).
